What is the friendship family program?

The Office of International Programs matches international students with local families and singles. The goal is for the student to learn about and experience American culture outside of Lander. We also hope that the student will share his/her culture with you and your family. This is the start of what could be a lifelong relationship where you and your student will learn from each other and grow together. We hope that this experience will encourage you to break stereotypes, discover your own city, and continue the international experience once your student returns to his/her home country. What do you do?

Activities with friendship families depend on the interests of the family and student.
